Hose releases from pump

A worker received injuries to his head when he was struck by a camlock fitting attached to a layflat hose when the hose released from the diesel pump under pressure.



MinEx data on incidents with the potential to cause harm over the past 5 years show 4% of incidents (271 incidents) involve pressure release, of which 97 involved hydraulic pressure.

You need to ensure that:

- 1. All diesel pumps are fitted with relief valves at discharge.
- Where appropriate, whip chains/ straps or other protection devices are used on pressurised hoses to secure them in the event of separation under pressure.
- Pressure release hazards are identified and appropriate controls are implemented.
