Near miss - Crane wedge and socket

A hire crane was on site when the wire rope pulled through the terminal end wedge and socket.

The investigation found that the wedge and socket were not a pair, and the wedge was too wide. It did not put adequate clamping pressure on the rope.

Falls are a major cause of fatalities in the extractives sector, both in New Zealand and internationally. Of the now nine fatalities in the extractives sector since 2011, six of them were a result of falls.

MinEx data on incidents with the potential to cause harm over the 45 months to Mar 2021 show 16% of all incidents (608 incidents) involve falls, of which 5% (192 incidents) involved fall of equipment.



You need to ensure that:

- 1. Contract operators are trained and assessed as competent to operate mobile equipment. This needs to include model/equipment specific training and assessment.
- 2. Equipment is fit for purpose and operated in accordance with Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) requirements.
- 3. You consider having the terminal ends on hired cranes pulled apart to ensure that the wedge is correct for the socket and the wedge is properly set before use.
