Trespassers on site

While loading a dump truck near a riverbed, an excavator operator slewed around and noticed a child close to the digger door approximately 7 metres away. The operator spoke to the child who asked for a cigarette for his mother.

The worker had noticed a van parked on the riverbank earlier and had suspected the van was there overnight. At about 9am a mother and her 5 children emerged from the van.

River extraction, where public access is permitted, represents a significant hazard and while the public do not see themselves as trespassing, they are on a mine site and are captured by the Health & Safety at Work Act 2015.

MinEx data on incidents with the potential to cause harm over the 42 months to Dec 2020 show 30% of all incidents (1,044 incidents) involve vehicles, of which 33 incidents involved potential collisions with pedestrians.



You need to ensure that:

- 1. Where practical, sites are secure and restrict access to trespassers.
- Extreme care is taken where quarrying operations interact with the public and that the mining area is barricaded to restrict access.
- Appropriate signs are clearly visible to alert the public to the hazards present in the quarrying area.
