INCIDENT TYPE	SUMMARY	COMMENTS TO INDUSTRY
Dangerous incident IncNot0037487 Underground metals mine	A crew was conducting a flush of a paste pipe reticulation system between levels. Upon inspection of the system at one level, there were no visible signs of the flush. Following confirmation from the paste plant that the pressure in the pipes had dropped from a peak of 350kPa to 60kPa, the crew confirmed with the paste plant that they wanted the pressure released from the system. The crew proceeded to another level to remove a blast cap for inspection, and while a crew member was undoing clamps on the pipe, the blast cap blew off. This released the built-up water pressure in the system. One worker	Relief valves should be installed at inspection points in reticulation systems to dissipate pressure before removing any caps from the system. Mine operators should review how workers and supervisors are trained to recognise the potential hazards associated with all energy sources. This is especially important when there is the potential for unexpected stored energy, associated with blockages, to be released without warning.

Fire or explosion

A mine worker saw a flash from a 1000 volt conveyor drive motor junction box. The electrical protection system activated and shut down the conveyor. There were no injuries.

The incidents in this report therefore have not necessarily occurred in a one-week period.
